De Quervain's Release

De Quervain's Tenosynovitis is manifested as pain in line with the thumb about a centimeter proximal to the wrist crease. It is usually extremely painful. I can't remember ever curing this with an injection or splinting. The surgery is easily **done** under local anesthetic in the office. Office procedures save money by avoiding costly hospital copayments. No therapy or cast is needed after the procedure. It takes about 5 to 10 minutes.

Post-operative instructions

I hope your procedure was not too traumatic! Here are some tips to help you recover well:

- 1. Keep elevated as much as possible for a couple of days.
- 2. If you are allowed to take Advil (ibuprofen over the counter) then take 4 pills every 8 hours for 48 hours starting upon arrival at home even if you aren't hurting.
- 3. Return to work when you feel comfortable knowing that you need to take it easy on this wrist for a week or so.
- 4. You may Tylenol ES 2 pills every 6 hours for pain even though you are taking Advil. 5. You may or may not have a follow up appointment.
